## Monthly Ride Report

Greetings from the monthly ride committee. The team has tried to make this year interesting for all with some different locations to ride and to camp. Our first ride of the year is now History and turned out to be a perfect day. A lot of compliments were received, especially of our greeters Don Horn and Chuck Gallant that did a excellent job in helping with the parking and greeting our members and quests. Thanks guys!!

Our next big event and ride campout will be March 22 and 23 at the Stagecoach Trails. Which is located in the high desert, Shelter Valley, 16 miles southeast of Julian and 44 miles north of Highway 8 at Ocotillo. There are showers and clean restroom that are almost new. There is also a pool, laundry, Wi-Fi, a general store and horse corrals. We will be setting up at the Horse camping area in which you can bring your own portable corrals, trailer tie or rent pipe corrals from the campground. Saturday riding is on your own, be careful as you can only ride on designated trails. Saturday night we will have our main dinner (5pm) at the lodge, (6) PM we have arranged for the band that played at the annual dinner dance. That means we will have dancing under the stars with a nice campfire. Jim Sheridan will provide our dinner meal at \$25 per person. Breakfast will be served the following morning at \$15 per person and the ride will leave at 10am for a four (4) hour ride looping around Blair Valley. With a bar stop. As we returned Jim will have a lunch for \$20 per person. Please look up the Stagecoach trails web site for any other details and reservations.

Andy Dvorak and Brett Lesser will be our greeters for this ride. Andy has put a lot of effort into this event. He has submitted the following for more detail: Good morning Gents, I have been in communication with the RV park managers and spoke to them about how to keep the arrivals flowing into the park. Members and guest with their own rigs and horses do not have to check in at the office. I will greet the members/guest at the horse area. I will collect all the money from the individuals at this time.

According to the managers usually one person from

the group will settle up the bills some time on Sunday. At this point, if you want the cost per rig/camper/trailer/horse can be collected by either Lessor, or Myself. The cost break down for the overnight camping and individual horse is as follows:

\$22 per night for camping/RV space. Electrical, water, and sewer are included in this price.

\$8 per night per horse. Includes stall were available and water. Bring own buckets/water hose and feed.

\$8 per horse that arrive on Sunday day of club ride.

The members who are renting cabins will have to stop at the office and pay for their individual arrangements.

If there is anything else I can do or you suggest let me know. I will be able to arrive at the RV park on Saturday in the morning and start the weekend. We hope this will be a great week-end
