A Pacific Beach Junior High School student suffered major injuries at 11:45 a.m. yesterday when his bicycle collided with an auto in the 2200 block on Garnet street.

The youth, John C. McMasters, 12, of 1212 De Anza Rd., Pacific Beach, suffered head and shoulder injuries and was treated by a physician and taken to Scripps Memorial Hospital.

W. D. Morrison, a police accident investigator, said young McMasters was riding west on Garnet street when Harry Grove Jr., of 3721 Mt. Sandy Dr., opened the left door of his auto parked at the curb.

Morrison said the youth swerved and ran into the side of an auto driven by Mrs. Evelyn May Sawtell, 54, of 4035 Clairemont Mesa Blvd. No citations were issued.

# Youth, 17, Held As Suspect In Del Mar Holdup

A 17-year-old youth arrested by Lynnwood police has admitted robbing a Del Mar race track blacksmith's helper of his wallet on Jan. 8, the Sheriff's office was informed yesterday.

The youth, who was identified as Lester Woods, a deserter from the North Island Naval Air Station, named two 17-year-old cousins from Compton and Norwalk as being his accomplices.

The blacksmith's helper, Carl William (Fuzzy) Meeker, 51, told sheriff's deputies he was robbed of his wallet containing about \$14 and miscellaneous papers about 4:50 a.m. as he walked from a bus stop toward the race track.

Meeker said the youths approached in an auto with its lights out and demanded his wallet after one of the three told another, "Give me the gun out of the glove compartment."

He said the youths turned and drove toward U.S. Highway 101 after the robbery. Lynnwood police investigators quoted the youth as saying an auto belonging to the Norwalk cousin was used in the holdup.

# December Use Of Water Soars

A dry December sent water use soaring more than 50 percent above the consumption level in December, 1937, County Water Authority directors have announced.

Richard S. Holmgren, general manager and chief engineer of CWA, said last month's use was 12,878.8 acre-feet, compared with 8,268.8 in December, 1937. An acre-foot is 325,900 gallons.

Holmgren said, however, that CWA agencies have nearly twice as much stored water—155,632 against 86,736 acre-feet—than they had a year ago.

# 2 Hurt In Auto-Truck Collision; Driver Cited

Grover Cleveland Churchill, 28, a sailor from the landing ship dock Comstock, was arrested on suspicion of felony drunken driving Friday night after two persons were injured in an auto-pickup crash. Police said an auto he was driving struck the rear of the pickup at 41st and Wightman streets.

Churchill was released from City Jail yesterday after posting a \$1,050 bail bond. Harry F. Haas, a police accident investigator, said a 1930 model coupe driven by Churchill was demolished. The investigator estimated damage to the pickup truck, driven by Arthur Gerald Solkema, of 3526 41st St., at \$150.

Solkema's wife, Bertha, 49, and Grady W. Faircloth, 43, a sailor from the Comstock, who was a passenger in Churchill's auto, suffered minor injuries. Faircloth was treated at the scene for injuries suffered when his head broke the windshield of the auto. He then was booked in the jail on a drunk charge.

Mrs. Solkema was taken home without requiring treatment. Haas said she suffered a large bump on her head where it struck the rear window of the truck. Five persons were arrested on suspicion of drunken driving late Friday and yesterday in San Diego County.
