Dick Powell's forays into acting have been increasingly rare these last few years. What happened, anyway? Did he grow tired of acting? Powell shrugged. "I grew tired of holding my stomach in," he explained. He sat at a huge desk weighted with scripts, filming schedules, budg-ets and other small-print details that per-

petually bedevil a producer with irons in assorted fires, and he seemed very content

with his lot. Powell is president of Four Star Produc-

tions which, to begin with, is a misnomer and one with a story behind it. "We started out eight years ago last September with an idea," Powell recalled, leaning back in his swivel chair, looking every inch the successful tycoon.
"The idea was that TV was new and

could use acting names and we, in turn, could make money. Originally there were four of us to fit the title—Charles Boyer, Joel McCrea, Rosalind Russell and myself. Everyone, including my wife, thought we were crazy going into TV. Well, McCrea was the first to change his mind. He has dough socked away and he just didn't want to work that hard. Then Roz got frightened when she realized how rough the TV cameras were in

"That left Boyer and me," Powell went on, "and so we started 'Four Star Playhouse.' Later, we got David Niven for a guest spot on our series one week. And then-well, one thing led to another and soon David was in the fold. And that made three. Eight years have passed and we still haven't got that fourth star.'

Beginning with "Four Star Playhouse," a consistently good series, Four Star Productions began expanding to its present monolithic proportions as the largest independent producing company in television. Nine series' are currently produced under the Four Star banner, including "Dick Powell's Zane Grey Theater," "Rifleman," the June Allyson Show and "Robert Taylor's Detectives," among them. Four Star is not about to stop there, either.

On the planning boards for next season are several more Four Star shows, such as a situation comedy starring Tom Ewell, "Willie Dante," the private eye series, and an hourlong western, "Stagecoach West," which has just been scheduled by ABC.

Powell, as a man with his finger on the pulse, was asked what he thought lay on the horizon for television in general. He reflected a moment and said, more comedies and half of them will be lousy because there just aren't enough creative people to go around. There'll be westerns because they'll always be westerns, and of course we'll have private eyes, too.'

Powell created the role of Willie Dante, a gambler-private eye, but in the new series he'll be played by Howard Duff. "It'll be 20 percent private eye, 80 percent comedy," Powell observed. "I think back to that great line from 'Casablanca,' the Humphrey Bogart line. Someone put the question to Bogie, 'Why did you leave the States, women or murder?' Bogie shrugged. 'A little of both,' he said. That to me is the perfect formula. Keep 'em

At this juncture Powell isn't certain to what extent Willie Dante will follow the gambling trade. Uplift is in the saddle at the networks at the moment and, according to Powell, one of the networks, CBS, has gone so far as to delete the gambling theme from all future "Mr. Lucky" shows which will be a neat trick. "So we know right now that CBS wouldn't buy 'Willie Dante' as it now stands,'

Powell said with a shrug.

We fell to talking about his own performing career, a wonderfully durable one, and Powell said, "For years and years, even after I had plenty of pictures under my belt, I kept practicing my saxophone. I never knew when this acting business would blow up in my face, and a guy has to have something to fall back on."

Turning serious. Powell said, "I've always tried to stay ahead of the trends in this business. Years ago I was a bandleader in vaudeville. When it was obvious that vaudeville was dying I knew it was time to look around. Then after I did all right in Hollywood musicals I could see that trend passing. The next step was into private eye

movies and then 'Richard Diamond' on radio and so on.
"I was an actor for 25 years." Powell said. "Right
now I'm the host on 'Zane Grey Theater' and I act in about three of them a year. That, I think, is just about enough to get all the ham out of my system."




