# Tom Komar; specialist in barrier-free design

Tom Komar, an architect who in recent years specialized in barrierfree design and served on many boards and committees concerning the disabled, died Saturday in his La Jolla home after a long illness. He was 33.

He was born in Bedford, Ohio, and attended Kent State University and completed architectural studies at the University of Michigan.

Mr. Komar, who worked from a wheelchair, became a specialist in barrier-free design after he was disabled in a 1980 automobile accident. He also taught principles of barrier-free design to interior design students.

Many of his architectural jobs were in conjunction with governmental and public agency developments. He also was contracted to modify plans for the new system of freeway telephones to make them more accessible to the disabled.

He had been chairman of the board of directors for Community Service Center for the Disabled since 1988 and was a member of the city's Committee to Remove Architectural Barriers (CRAB).

Mr. Komar served on the county Committee on Persons With Disabilities and on the Senior and Disabled Access Advisory Committee to the San Diego Trolley. He was a member of the County Building Department Appeals Board.

Survivors include his parents, Nicholas and Irene Komar of Bedford, Ohio; brother and sister, Richard of Cuyahoga Falls, Ohio, and June of Coronado; also devoted friends and associates. Kimberly Sherwood and Brendan Boshell and family of San Diego.






